

d) Past Tense of Regular Verbs: Affirmative, Interrogative, Negative Forms

<i>AFFIRMATIVE</i>	<i>INTERROGATIVE</i>	<i>NEGATIVE</i>
I played.	Did I play?	I did not (didn't) play.
He studied.	Did he study?	He did not (didn't) study.
We worked.	Did we work?	We did not (didn't) work.
You stopped.	Did you stop?	You did not (didn't) stop.
They stayed.	Did they stay?	They did not (didn't) stay.

- 1) The auxiliary forms **DID** (for the interrogative form) and **DIDN'T** (for the negative form) are used for all persons in the Past Tense of non-auxiliary verbs.
- 2) **DID/DIDN'T** are followed by the simple form of the principal verb.
- 3) **DIDN'T** is the contraction of **DID NOT**.
